Responsibilities

- Participate in the admissions process and work cooperatively with the Office of Admissions to ensure a high-quality student body.
- Perform other university and departmental duties as expected of all faculty, including serving on committees, attending faculty meetings, and engaging in community service.

Required Qualifications

- Doctorate in Counselor Education & Supervision, preferably from a CACREP-accredited program at the time of appointment.
- Candidates who have A.B.D. status in Counselor Education, with conferral of the doctorate prior to start date, will also be considered.
- Candidate must be, at minimum, license-eligible prior to the start date.

- Currently licensed as LIMHP, or similar full licensure such as LPC that has reciprocity in NE.
- Evidence of successful experience in providing individual or triadic clinical supervision.
- Evidence of successful teaching experience.
- Experience with current CMHC CACREP standards and expectations.
