

TENURE TRACK FACULTY IN THE DEPARTMENT OF COUNSELING, CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING, SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

Summary

The Department of Counseling at John Carroll University seeks to fill a tenure-track assistant professor position in Counselor Education. Full consideration will be given to applications that are complete by December 1, 2018, although applications will be accepted until the position is filled. The hire start date is August 2019.

The position will support and primarily teach in the Department's Substance Use Disorders Counseling programs (graduate, undergraduate, and CEU programs). Responsibilities also include teaching courses in the broader clinical mental health counseling curriculum, practicum and internship supervision, academic advisement, scholarly activity, and service to the university, community, and counseling profession. The University is dedicated to a balance between research and teaching excellence that contributes to a rich intellectual environment. Faculty with a course load reduction for research teach nine hours per semester (3 courses). All faculty members serve as academic advisors. Advising responsibility is phased in over time.

- Doctoral degree from a CACREP-accredited counseling program (ABD acceptable if degree will be awarded by hire date)
- Valid license, or license eligible, as a Professional Clinical Counselor in Ohio
- Evidence of potential for research and publishing in the field of Clinical Mental Health Counseling and substance use disorders

Preferred Qualifications

- Supervisory designation in Ohio (LPCC-S)
- License Independent Chemical Dependency Counselor (LICDC) credential. Applicants without this license will be expected to earn it.
- Experience teaching graduate-level courses in Counselor Education
- Experience teaching courses on substance use disorders
- Clinical experience working in the field of substance use disorders counseling
- Established record of scholarly publications
- Experience with Integrated Behavioral Health
- Experience with CACREP accreditation standards
- Interest or experience in program coordination and leadership
- Experience supervising counseling practicum and internship students
- Active participation in state/national counseling organizations and related community organizations
