Two Positions for Clinical Assistant Professors - Starting Fall, 2019

One position will be a Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling Clinical Faculty and the second anticipated position is open as a Clinical Mental Health or Rehabilitation Counseling Clinical Faculty member.

PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

The Department of Counselor Education and Counseling Psychology at Marquette University is seeking candidates for Clinical Faculty positions in Clinical Rehabilitation and Clinical Mental Health Counseling beginning August 2019. Candidates must be able to teach graduate-level counseling courses with a focus on clinical rehabilitation and clinical mental health counseling.

Applicants must have an earned doctorate either in Counselor Education, ideally from a CACREP-accredited program, or a related degree with a year or more of experience teaching in a counselor education program before July 1, 2013. We are particularly interested in applicants with a focus in clinical rehabilitation counseling for one of the positions, and for the other anticipated opening preference will be given to applicants with expertise in counseling with children and adolescents or addictions counseling. Applicants may be ABD, but the doctoral degree must be completed by August 15, 2019. The successful applicant will have evidence of strong teaching and supervision skills, multicultural counseling competence and a commitment to social justice advocacy. Immediate eligibility for Wisconsin licensure is desirable. Faculty who would contribute to the cultural diversity of our faculty are strongly encouraged to apply.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE POSITION

The department seeks applicants with broad expertise and experience in clinical rehabilitation counseling or clinical mental health counseling to teach courses in the counseling core, and in the specialties of clinical rehabilitation and clinical mental health counseling. Faculty responsibilities include teaching and advising in the counseling programs and participating in professional and community service. In addition, all faculty members contribute to curriculum development, program assessment and other administrative tasks.

RANK AND SALARY

The appointment will be made at the Clinical Assistant Professor level. Salary is competitive and based upon the applicant's qualifications and experience.

THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Counselor Education and Counseling Psychology (CECP) is situated in the College of Education with eight tenure track full-time faculty members, approximately 70 masters and 20 doctoral students. The Department offers two master's degree counseling programs; a 60-hour program in Clinical Mental Health Counseling (with optional specializations in Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling, Child and Adolescent Counseling and Addictions Counseling) and a 48-hour School Counseling program that are CACREP-accredited (see <http://www.marquette.edu/education/grad/cecp.shtml>). The new specialization in Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling begins in the Fall of 2019. The department also offers an APA-accredited doctoral program in Counseling Psychology. All three programs integrate multicultural perspectives, social justice and advocacy throughout the curriculum. All programs are approved by their respective Wisconsin State Regulatory Boards for meeting the educational requirements for licensure.
