The successful candidate will provide culturally sensitive instruction in the CACREP-accredited core and clinical mental health counseling specialization areas, engage in an active agenda of scholarly/creative activity (including external funding), and provide service to the department, college of education, university, community, and profession. The development and maintenance of positive relationships and partnerships with community-based mental and behavioral health organizations (for profit/non-profit) is expected. The University of Nebraska at Omaha is committed to a diverse work and classroom environment for students, faculty and staff. Members of minority and underrepresented groups are strongly encouraged to apply.

Duties and Responsibilities: Duties include teaching courses in the core and clinical mental health counseling specialization areas; active engagement in scholarly/creative activities leading to publication; advising graduate students; supervising practicum and internship experiences; collaborating with schools; community-based mental health organizations, service activities at the program, department, college, university, and professional levels; and generating external funding.

Educational Requirement: An earned doctorate in Counselor Education.

Required Qualifications: Successful candidate must have content and working knowledge of CACREP standards and policies; evidence of scholarly/creative activity leading to publication in quality peer reviewed journals; evidence of professional service.

Desirable Qualifications: Preference given to candidates with prior experience as a licensed professional counselor/mental health professional; proven ability to teach in a CACREP-accredited core and clinical mental health counseling specialization area; a minimum of 2 years of experience as a licensed counselor; evidence of scholarly research, professional service, and external funding.

Rank and Salary: Assistant Professor. Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.
